The players had fun, learned plenty and have established a solid foundation for future championships at both the youth

and high school levels.

The JVs also took another step forward as they were far more competitive than ever before against the top teams in BC. They were a game away from winning their league and saw their season end in a close loss playoff to the eventual provincial champions. Many of the JVs also played key roles with the Varsity team every week. Thanks to **Coach Oatway** for another job well done.

The Varsity team had by far its best season to date finishing in a tie atop the AAA Western Conference with a

5-1 record (10-3 overall). In their first ever Final Four appearance, they lost a hard-fought 36-28 semi-final game to the eventual provincial champions. In the process, the Hyacks' new Wing-T offence led the province by rushing for over 4300 yards and 40 TDs.

Most importantly we have raised expectations for this program – only competing at a championship level is acceptable.

High School News & Notes

PREPARATIONS FOR 2008 SEASON UNDERWAY

Champions are made in the off-season, and so preparations have already begun for what promises to be an even more exciting 2008 season. The first week back to school saw the high school weight room packed with over 50 hard-working student athletes looking to improve their physical conditioning in anticipation of a championship run next November. JV head coach Chad Oatway, who is in charge of the off-season strength and conditioning programs, met with returning and new players to hand out program and nutrition information as well as go through weight room expectations, base exercises and proper and safe lifting techniques. He remarked that in addition to a strong group of 23 players moving up from the junior bantam program, over twenty other young men in grades 9 and 10 have expressed interest in joining the program, reflecting the growing interest in the sport at NWSS.

The weight program is split into three five-week phases focused on growth, strength and power to best prepare the players for spring training in May and June. During this next week (Jan 14-18), the players will undergo "base-line" testing in the weight room, giving the athletes and coaches a concrete number against which to track progress throughout the spring. We ask that players try to work out with their position groups wherever possible, as follows:

- Monday and Wednesday: Lineman & Inside Linebackers
- Tuesday and Thursday: Backs, Receivers & Outside Linebackers
- Friday: Open weight room for all positions
