HYACKS CELEBRATE SENIORS NIGHT WITH VICTORY



The winningest Hyack Seniors ever

Brent Fletcher tied the single season interception record with his 5th pick of the season.

Thanks to all of the parents who were on hand, especially the new "Mom's Dance Team" who entertained the crowd. The Hyacks finish the regular season with a 9-1 record (4-1 in conference play) and are ranked 3rd in BC. They will have a bye this weekend and play the winner of the Terry Fox/Carson game in the quarter finals on Nov 19th at McLeod Stadium in Langley.

The 22 seniors are the winningest group of Hyacks ever. They have made the playoffs and been among the top teams in the province in all four seasons (2 JV and 2 varsity). Many of them have played key roles on the varsity team since the 10th grade, posting a 26-8 record since 2007, and hopefully have 3 more wins to come. They also led the team to back to back semi-final berths and a first ever number one provincial ranking this year.




JV'S WRAP UP REGULAR SEASON WITH THRILLING WIN

The JV Hyacks rose above the miserable weather and a quick 14 point deficit on Thursday night to end the regular season with a huge win over Notre Dame. The defense was tested early with the power running game of the Jugglers. **Jonathan He** secured the edge at crunch time in the game and let the great Hyack linebacking core make big plays. None bigger than the goal line stand shutting Notre Dame out 4 times from inside the five yard line in the 4th quarter. That proved the game changer as the offense getting the ball back saw **Julian Katz** run a 97 yard touchdown with just under a minute to play, to score his 3rd touchdown of the game. The Hyacks open the playoffs this Thursday against Terry Fox at Mercer Stadium. Kickoff is 5:30 pm.

SEVEN HYACKS REWARDED WITH ALL-STAR SELECTIONS



Vivie Bojilov *

Defensive Player of the Year

Vivie has been a dominant force on both sides of the ball and was also the runner up in voting for league's offensive MVP. He is among the province's leaders in tackles with 55 and 3 sacks, along with currently sitting 2nd in BC with 1277 rushing yards and 12 TDs. Vivie also broke school rushing records with 301 yards in a game and a 99 yard run from scrimmage. He was named provincial player of the week with a 255 yard, 4 TD rushing performance vs Notre Dame. Vivie is a team captain and is 2nd on the schools career tackling list with 162.



Daniel English *

Receiver

Daniel earns his 2nd consecutive all-conference selection and was a provincial all-star in 2008. He is among the provincial leaders in all receiving categories (25 rec, 451 yards, 18 ypr, 6 TDs) and has also added another 600 yards and 3 TDs in rushing and returns. Daniel currently holds 5 NWSS receiving records including career receptions (64), yards (1354) and TDs (17).



Brent Fletcher

Safety

Brent tied the Hyack single-season interception record this season with 5 and is 4th on the team with 38 tackles. He also has 442 all-purpose yards and 4 TDs on offense. Brent is also a 2-year starter and a team captain.



Rama MacMillan *

Offensive line

Rama earns his 2nd consecutive all-conference selection and was a provincial all-star in 2008. He plays a key role on an offense that is averaging over 45 points and 450 yards per game. He is a 3-year starter at OT also a starter on defense.



Casey Chin *

Linebacker

Casey earns his second consecutive all-conference selection and currently leads the league in tackles with 77 (4th in BC). He was a provincial all star in 2008 and is a 3 year starter. He currently holds the NWSS career record for tackles with 167. Casey also plays guard on offense, is a team captain and the 2008 winner of the Sidoo Family Scholarship.



Alex Saavedra

Defensive line

Ales earns his 2nd consecutive all-conference selection after having his season unfortunately cut short last week by injury. He finished with 19 tackles and a sack, including a career-high 5 tackles in his last game. He is a 3-year starter.



Warren Reese

Running back

Warren is tied for the team lead in TDs with 12 and is 2nd in rushing with 630 yards. Defensively he is a 2-year starter at DE and leads the team with 4 sacks.

The seven all-stars ties last years mark for the most ever in one season for the Hyacks. Also receiving votes were Shiraz Chaudhary (LB), Torsten Jaccard (QB) and Milan Scekcic (O-line). Congratulations to all of these players on an outstanding season thus far.

YOUTH UPDATE

The flag team got to play under the lights at Mercer Stadium as the opening act for the varsity game on Friday night. Armaan Sidhu scored a touchdown for the Hyacks against the North Delta Longhorns, while Xavier Venkataya and Lucas Cortan also had nice runs. Dante Baylis was the defensive leader for the Hyacks from his safety position. Dylan Bath was selected to be the honorary captain for the varsity game which followed.

The atom Hyacks hosted the Westside Warriors for their final game of the year. It was a soggy and muddy affair, and the boys had a ton of fun. Phoenix Bourrier and Ethan van Kalsbeek had the majority of the offense for the Hyacks, who eventually fell 14-0 to the Warriors. On defense, Shaye Rathjen, Isaac Hughes and Marcus Allen had several outstanding tackles. Coach Norm Stevens and his staff are to be congratulated on a very successful inaugural season, one in which the boys won three games and were leading in several other games until the final minutes. There's certainly a strong foundation of returning players for next season at both atom and peewee.

The peewee Hyacks Black team stormed out of the gates for the post-season peewee jamboree, clobbering the Burnaby Lions 31-0 in a short game. Calvin Singh, Taylor Jensen, Jamie Shiho and Jeff Lugtu had huge games in all facets: scoring touchdowns, dragging tacklers for extra yards, and making big plays on defense and special teams. Sarban Sidhu was an unstoppable force on the line of scrimmage. Coach Dosanjh's team then parlayed their success in the opening game into an outstanding effort against Coach Bridge's Orange squad in a full-length game. In the end, the fresher legs of the Orange team outlasted the Black onslaught, winning 25-19 with a late touchdown run by Michael Thind. This final game was a fantastic display of the amazing progress in skill, effort and enthusiasm that these peewee teams made in 2009 – especially notable considering that over 80% of these players had never played football before.

The two Hyacks junior bantam teams faced off in a playoff game to determine fifth place in the league. Hyped as "The Civil War – Part II", this game featured two skilled, high-effort teams battling enthusiastically in a very clean and exciting game. The Black team leapt out to a quick 22-point lead off of offensive outbursts by Mackenzie Ratcliffe, James Nicolas and Tristan Clayton, while the solid defense of Ryan Rickaby, Nathan Barber and Jonathan Cote held the Orange team in check for the first half. In the second half, Coach Stefaniuk's Orange squad started rumbling, with Tommy Robertson, Prabh Bal and Dylan Hill rushing for several tough yards and closing the gap on the scoreboard. In the end, late scores by Hyacks Black fullbacks Julian Ochoa and Stewart Sommerfeld pushed the final score to 35-19, with Tommy Robertson scoring on an impressive long run for Orange to close out the game. Coach Leslie's Black team was awarded the beautiful Hyacks Bowl trophy at the end of their game. In all, the two team combined for a very successful season, winning seven games in all.

The youth teams will celebrate their most successful season ever with an awards ceremony and wrap-up party on November 18 at the Justice Institute theater.
