2009 SEASON IN REVIEW



2009 was the best season yet for the Hyack Football program. The Varsity team reached the provincial semi-finals for the 3rd straight year before falling to the eventual provincial champions from Centennial. The team began the season 8-0 despite playing the toughest schedule in BC. They were ranked number one in BC for the first time in the history of the program, before finishing with a 10-2 record (4-1 in league play). The highlight of the season was a hard-fought quarter final victory over defending provincial champion Terry Fox.


Also for the 3rd straight year, the Hyacks' offence led the province with over 5200 yards and finished with a school record 63 TDs (38 ppg). Five Hyacks were honored at the Subway Provincial All-star Awards banquet (pictured left):

Torsten Jaccard earned a BCSSFA provincial scholarship, while Vivie Bojilov, Casey Chin, Daniel English and Rama MacMillan were named to the Gatorade Provincial All-star team. Bojilov earned provincial defensive player of the year honors. Others honored this year included All-conference selections Brent Fletcher, Warren Reece and Alex Saavedra. Many of the above mentioned will have the opportunity to play college football next year.

The JVs meanwhile returned to their winning ways in 2009. Despite a roster loaded with first year players, the team managed a 6-5 record with 3 of the losses coming by 7 points or less. A thrilling win over Notre Dame and a dominating playoff win over Terry Fox highlighted the JV season. More than 40 players finished the season, laying the groundwork for future varsity success.

The youth program saw tremendous growth in 2009 with the addition of Atom and Flag teams. In all close to 120 players and 25 coaches suited up on 6 Hyack youth teams. The players demonstrated a positive attitude, worked hard, had fun and learned plenty about the world's greatest team sport! Thanks to all of the players, coaches, parents and volunteers for their support. You can bet there will be even more people involved in 2010!

PREPERATIONS FOR 2010 SEASON UNDERWAY

While the Hyacks will graduate 22 key seniors, expectations will still be high for 2010. Following the holiday break, formal workouts will begin on January 4th. Coach Oatway will again be in charge of the off-season strength and conditioning program and will meet with returning and new players to hand out program and nutrition information as well as go through weight room expectations, base exercises and proper and safe lifting techniques.

The weight program is split into three five-week phases focused on growth, strength and power to best prepare the players for spring training in May and June. During the first two weeks of January, the players will undergo "base-line" testing in the weight room, giving the athletes and coaches a concrete number against which to track progress throughout the spring. Lineman workouts and speed training will begin in February.

Off-season schedules and goal setting sheets have already been emailed to players. If you haven't already done so, all Varsity players will also need to schedule an individual meeting with Coach Lalji before the end of the semester.

On Monday, January 4th there will be a FULL TEAM MEETING in room 188 at 3:15 pm.

All new players are also encouraged to attend this meeting, so if you know of anyone who is interested in joining next season, please have them attend. * Jackets will also be ordered at this meeting for returning players only.

FOOTBALL FEES DUE IN FEBRUARY

The \$200 registration fees for Varsity and JV players are due in February. Hyack team clothing will be provided for returning players once fees have been paid.
