### HYACKS STAGE ANOTHER 4th QUARTER COMEBACK

Warren Reece's 2nd TD of the game with 1:37 to play lifted the Varsity Hyacks to a thrilling 36-33 win over WJ Mouat in a battle of top five teams in BC. The game featured 7 lead changes, and record setting performances by QB **Torsten Jaccard** and WR **Daniel English**. Jaccard threw for 261 yards, surpassing the mark of 240 set by Ben Davies against Squaticum (WA) in 2005. English caught 9 passes for 161 yards, bettering records previously held by Nathan Pedersen (7 rec vs Frank Hurt, 2003) and Marc Moore (151 yds vs Notre Dame, 2005). Daniel scored 1 TD in the game and his other 8 receptions all resulted in first downs.

**Brent Fletcher** opened the scoring for the Hyacks on a 40 yd TD reception in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter, tying the game at 7-7. Fletcher continued his great all-around play this season, finishing with 125 all-purpose yards along with 4 tackles and an interception on defense. **Nigel Eberding** also scored for the visitors. Defensively, **Vivie Bojilov** finished with 12 tackles and a sack, while **Casey Chin** added 11 tackles for the 2<sup>nd</sup> straight game. The Hyacks remain undefeated at 3-0 and are ranked 2nd in BC.

### HOMECOMING THIS FRIDAY

All Hyack Football Alumni, this is the game you have all been waiting for! The annual Homecoming game will take place on Friday, Sept 25<sup>th</sup> when the Hyacks take on Kelowna at Mercer Stadium. The Owls are 2-0 this season after a showing steady improvement at the same team camp in Oregon the Hyacks attended in July. The atom Hyacks lost a heart-breaker on Friday night against the visiting Coquitlam Bears, who scored a touchdown in the final minute to take a 16-13 lead. Ethan van Keelsbeek scored both Hyacks TDs, one in each half. The Hyack defence held Coquitlam to just one touchdown for most of the game, forcing 3 turnovers, including two fumbles recovered by Paul Roadilla. Roadilla also had a solo quarterback sack, and combined with Shaye Rathjen for another. The Hyacks will look to get back to their winning ways next Sunday in Cloverdale, before competing at halftime of the BC Lions game on October 2nd at BC Place Stadium.

The two peewee Hyacks teams faced off against each other in a highly-spirited and clean game on Sunday morning at Ryall Park. It was a close, back-and-forth game, with the Orange team eventually out-scoring the Black team 18-6. For the Orange squad, Jac Howe and Michael Thind had the bulk of the carries, with Sebastian Ochoa, Gurvir Ghuman and Christopher Kleefman scoring the touchdowns. The Black team scored on a nice long fourth-quarter run by the speedy Calvin Singh, with the remainder of their offense coming from Jamie Shiho and Jeff Lorenz-Lugtu. The teams will meet again in another head-to-head game on October 15 at Mercer Stadium.



Junior Bantam Black lost a close game in the dying minutes on Friday night against a talented Vancouver Trojans team. After leading 21-20 at halftime and 36-20 in the fourth quarter, turnovers killed the Hyacks' progress and put the ball in the hands of the Trojans, who scored the go-ahead touchdown with under three minutes remaining to win the game 42-36. James Nicolas, Mackenzie Ratcliffe and James Sommerfeld ran the ball well, while Ryan Rickaby, Tristan Clayton and Julian Ochoa were defensive standouts for the Hyacks.

Junior Bantam Orange lost a tough home-opener on Sunday to a big, fast Richmond Raiders squad, falling by a score of 42-12. Aaron Holloway, Billy Collins and Kale Brock led the offense, while Marc Massicotte and Gurveer Dhaliwal were defensive leaders. Next up for the Hyacks will be the Civil War Game: a

head-to-head match-up between the Orange and Black Hyacks teams on Thursday night at Mercer Stadium (6:00 pm kickoff).

## JAMAL AMONG TOP PROSPECTS FOR CFL DRAFT

Former Hyack Football star, **Nasser Jamal**, has been listed among the top prospects for the 2010 CFL Draft. According to a survey of league's GM and personnel, the 6'6" 290 pound offensive lineman is ranked #11 among draft eligible players. Last Saturday Nasser and the rest of his teammates at the University of Louisiana – Lafayette played at LSU in front of over 92,000 fans. This week he travels to another US college football Mecca, the University of Nebraska.
